Celebrating Success

All of us at HSCAZ have been working diligently to get the word out to the community about the amazing grant we received last fall. PetSmart Charities granted our shelter over \$92,000, with all funds to be used to help the community. In just nine months, we have surpassed all of our goals. To date, this generous grant provided the following for members of our community:

- 475 spay/neuter surgeries– These are huge numbers for our community considering just one cat and her offspring can produce 370,000 kittens in just 7 years *if not spayed* and one dog and her offspring can produce 67,000 puppies in just 6 years *if not spayed*.
- 550 exams with local veterinarians and at HSCAZ's mobile clinic– This helped vast members of the community get their dogs or cats medical attention who otherwise may have not been able to afford their pet's care.
- 775 vaccines– The vaccination of over 700 local pets will make a major impact in the future of our community. This will help stop the spread of infectious and potentially fatal diseases to our furry friends.

The hard work of everyone at HSCAZ has certainly paid off. We are incredibly thankful to PetSmart Charities and local veterinarians Dr. Snyder, Dr. Hallman, Dr. Sorensen, Dr. Gonzales and HSCAZ's veterinarian Dr. Christensen. We hope this grant will drastically lower the amount of homeless, lost or abandoned animals in our community.

STAFF PROFILE: HSCAZ's Behavior Team

Our shelter is focusing it's energies on expanding the behavior work that has been so successful over the past years. Our behavior team consists of staff and dedicated volunteers that study our canine and feline inhabitants to get a better understanding of their specific needs. This helps increase adoptability and reduce the number of adopters returning their newly adopted pets. Animals that have come into the shelter timid and afraid are now striving thanks to our new program. Every new animal is evaluated upon their initial medical exam and then they are worked with to help them feel more comfortable and confident in their new surroundings. Since the inception of our behavior program, we have seen a record number of adoptions and a decrease in "failed" adoptions and returns. By having a better understanding of that particular animal and their needs, we are able to advise potential adopters better and find the best fit for each pet and adopter.

Behavior Team Success Story- Lucky

Lucky came to HSCAZ as an owner surrender a few months ago. When he was brought to our shelter, he was aggressive to not only people but other dogs as well. After working with our behavior team, he is a whole new dog! He is excited to meet people, has a large group of canine friends around the shelter, goes on group walks with lots of other dogs and even attends off-site adoption events to meet new people. Our behavior team is still trying to teach Lucky how to love cats (he is a work in progress). Lucky's name suits him very well because had he been surrendered to a different shelter— he may not have been so lucky.

Thanks to you, The Humane Society of Central Arizona cared for 1,150 cats and dogs last year. We found 351 pets a new family through adoption, reunited 323 pets with their owners, transferred 34 dogs and cats to other shelters for a second chance adoption, cared for 30 dogs and cats that were temporarily unable to stay in their homes due to hospitalizations, rehabilitation, domestic violence, etc. and cared for 326 pets at our mobile clinic.
