
### RESCUED PETS AND THEIR PEOPLE

- **Q** Can human medications be toxic to pets?
- Medications prescribed to humans need to be kept away from dogs and cats. Ten very common poisonous human medications include:

Pain relievers - anti inflammatories

Acetaminophen

ADD/ADHD medications

**Antidepressants** 

Sleep aids

Birth control

Muscle relaxants

**Heart Medications** 

Thyroid hormones

Cholesterol lowering agents

Always consult with a veterinarian before administering medications to your pet.
