VOLUNTEERING

Ever wonder what you could do when you have a few hours to spare? Come volunteer for the Humane Society of Central Arizona. We are always accepting volunteer applications and there are several areas you could lend a hand (and your time) in.

Resale Store: You can volunteer in receiving where you can sort through donations, price items, and take donations out to the sales floor or up front at the cash register. Any volunteers that would like to help at our Resale Store will be contacted by the assistant manager, Vicky.

Shelter: Cat socialization, housekeeping (laundry/dishes), cat house cleaning, and/or dog walking.

HSCAZ has re-vamped the Volunteer Program at the shelter so all new volunteers that would like to share their time with the animals will need to attend a New Volunteer Orientation and a Hands-On Training (if working with dogs) which we try to hold monthly. CAN RECYCLING

HSCAZ is, again, collecting cans and transporting them to a recycling center instead of depending on Recyclops. We have cut <u>all</u> ties with Recyclops and as a result, HSCAZ has brought in almost \$6000 in the last 4 months. Thank you to everyone for dropping off their can recycling to help the homeless pets of Gila County.

THANKSGIVING SAFE/UNSAFE FOODS

SAVE FOODS

- **Sweet Potatoes:** When plainly cooked and served, it's okay for your dog to try a bite of sweet potatoes. Sweet potatoes are rich in fiber, vitamin B6, vitamin C and beta-carotene.
- **Potatoes:** A plain, cooked white potato is okay for your dog to try a bite. White potatoes contain vitamins C and B6.
- **Apples:** High in fiber, a small, plain slice of apple can be a good low-calorie treat for your pet.
- **Green beans:** Plain green beans, cooked or served raw, are also a good low-calorie treat to offer your pet. Green beans contain fiber, manganese and vitamins C and K.
- **Turkey meat:** Unseasoned, cooked and served in moderation, a small piece of turkey without bones or skin is a healthy protein treat for your pet.
- **Pumpkin:** Wonderful for digestion, plain, cooked pumpkin can be used in small amounts as a topper for your pet's Thanksgiving meal.

DANGEROUS FOODS

- **Gravy:** High in sodium content, seasonings and fat, gravy can cause an upset stomach in pets and may be toxic depending on what ingredients have been added during the cooking process.
- **Turkey bones:** Turkey bones should always be kept away from pets as they pose a choking hazard and can cause GI obstruction or perforation.
- **Garlic and onions:** These two foods contain n-propyl disulfide, which is toxic to pets, and should never be served.
- **Stuffing and casseroles:** High in sodium and often containing onion, stuffing and casseroles can cause an upset stomach or be toxic to your pet.
- Raisins and grapes: These foods are toxic to pets and can lead to organ failure.
- **Desserts:** With high amounts of sugar, these treats can be hard on your pet's stomach. Particularly dangerous are any sweets containing xylitol, which can be lethal when ingested by pets.
- **Alcoholic beverages:** Pets should never consume alcoholic beverages, as they can be toxic and may lead to vomiting, lethargy and organ damage.

YOUR PETS AND WINTER WEATHER

Cold temperatures can be just as hard, if not harder, on your pets as the hotter temps we see in Summer. Take extra precaution for your pets safety...
